AN ACT

To provide a penalty for violation of restrictions or orders with respect to persons entering, remaining in, leaving, or committing any act in military areas or zones.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*
3 That whoever shall enter, remain in, leave, or commit any
4 act in any military area or military zone prescribed, under
5 the authority of an Executive order of the President, by the
6 Secretary of War, or by any military commander designated
7 by the Secretary of War, contrary to the restrictions applica-
8 ble to any such area or zone or contrary to the order of the
9 Secretary of War or any such military commander, shall, if it
10 appears that he knew or should have known of the existence

1 and extent of the restrictions or order and that his act was in
2 violation thereof, be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon con-
3 viction shall be liable to a fine of not to exceed \$5,000 or to
4 imprisonment for not more than one year, or both, for each
5 offense.
