

Joint Resolution proposing
an amendment to the Constitution
of the United States.

Be it resolved by the Senate
and House of Representatives of the
United States of America in con-
gress assembled (two thirds concurring)
that the following article be sub-
mitted to the Legislatures of the sev-
eral States; and when adopted
by three fourths of the States shall
become a part of the Constitution
of the United States, and ^{be known}
as article fifteenth of amendments
to said Constitution.

Article 15. The right of suffrage
in the United States shall be based
upon citizenship, ^{and shall be regulated by Congress;} and all citizens of
the United States, whether native
or naturalized, shall enjoy this right
equally, without any distinction or
discrimination whatever founded
on race, color, or sex.
