RESOLUTION

Whereas, more than twelve years have elapsed since the ending of the World War and the commercial conditions have not yet been adjusted to their pre-war standard, and (those)

Whereas, ~~those~~ who served their country in time of peril have been especially handicapped by reason of loss of work and by being taken out of their line of endeavor during peace time to aid the country in time of war, and

Whereas this has rendered the country's defenders more keenly in need than the average citizen in this time of depression, and

Whereas aid at this time when the average Veteran has a growing family to whom he desires to teach the duties of the American Citizen and to impress upon his children the splendid privilege of being an American Citizen and the high duty of protecting that privilege at all costs and that this cannot be properly done by one who is hungry, ill-clad and under-nourished, however patriotic he may be, and

Whereas, it is better that aid be given to the Veteran now than in 1945 when he may no longer feel the need of it, therefore be it; RESOLVED

That we the undersigned Veterans of the World War respectfully memorialize Congress to pass adequate legislation to pay all adjusted compensation certificates in cash, without delay.
