At a regular meeting of Bradford Lodge No 228 Brotherhood of Railroad Trainmen held in the City of Bradford McKean County State of Pennsylvania on March 23d 1902. the following Resolutions were adopted.

Whereas. The bill known as the Grosvenor Anti Injunction bill H.R. 11060 now in the hands of the Committee on Rules, and is within their power to prevent this bill coming before Congress for consideration if they so desire. And

Whereas. We consider it is but right and in justice to the laboring classes of people in the State of Pennsylvania and the United States of America. That this bill known as H.R. 11060 should be allowed due consideration by the Committee on Rules in allowing it to come before Congress for there consideration and action.

And

Resolved. That a copy of these resolution be submitted to the Honorable Joseph C. Sibley Member of Congress with the request that he use his influence with the Members of Committee on Rules in allowing bill H.R. 11060 consideration.
